### Tuition Fees and Consumable Charges (Prep – Year 12)

Tuition Fees cover most core components of the educational program. King's College aims to keep tuition fees affordable to allow as many families as possible to access a Christian education. Other than Prep, Tuition Fees coincide with each sub-School. In addition to Tuition Fees each student is required to pay a Consumable Charge specific to their year level. This covers the costs of Stationary, Camps, Excursions, Sporting Activities, Workbooks, Online Resources and Skills Training Courses which vary from year to year depending on the activities being run.

The Fees and Consumables do not include the cost of some items including, uniforms, most sporting trips away from Warrnambool, optional camps/trips (such as Compass or Duke of Edinburgh) or voluntary instrumental music lessons. For students in Years 7 to 12 there is a booklist which is distributed to all families during Term 4 each year or upon enrolment. This cost is borne by families. Additional consumable charges may apply in Years 9-10 for some elective subjects where consumable expenses are higher (e.g., Food Technology and Wood Technology). Most VCE subjects also attract an additional charge for Edrolo (not included in Consumables).

### Sibling Discounts

Sibling discounts apply for the second and subsequent students of the same family attending King's College in Prep to Year 12. Family Concessions do not apply in the Early Years programs. Children from the same family must be attending the College at the same time to be eligible for sibling discounts. The child in the highest year level in a family is subject to the full tuition fee. Discounts are not applicable to Consumable Charges.

### Fee Payments

The full years tuition fee is invoiced in January and can either be paid in full or in instalments. Parents who pay the tuition fee in full at the beginning of the year will receive a 3% discount on tuition fees for Prep to Year 12 students. The discount does not apply to Consumables or Kinder Fees. Families who choose to pay tuition fees in instalments can do so either per term or over a 10-month instalment plan. Those families who choose either of these options, must enter into a direct debit arrangement with the College for the payment of fees by instalment. Direct debit forms will be forwarded upon confirmation of enrolment

## **Uniforms**

Details relating to College uniform requirements are distributed to newly enrolled families upon enrolment. All aspects of the College uniform except shoes are purchased from the College Uniform Shop.

## **BYOD (Bring Your Own Device)**

It is compulsory for each student in Year 7 to 12 to have their own computing device (iPad, Chromebook, Laptop or MacBook). It is very important that these devices meet our minimum specifications. For further information please speak to the IT Coordinator.

## **Insurance**

It is strongly recommended that parents check their health cover and insurance policies to ensure adequate medical, ambulance, personal property and liability insurance cover is held. The College does not accept responsibility for loss of, or damage to, personal effects and property, or for bodily injury or property damage incurred by students. The College arranges a 24-hour Student Injury / Accident insurance scheme, the cost of which is included in Tuition fees. Details of the scheme can be obtained from the Accounts office.

## **Building Fund**

The College operates a tax-deductible Building Fund, the contributions to which are voluntary and therefore tax deductible. Any contribution would be in addition to the fees/levies referred to above. Further details concerning the College Building Fund may be obtained from the Accounts Office. Donations are gratefully received and assist with the further development of the College facilities.

## **Overdue Accounts**

Once enrolled, fees and charges must be paid by the due date. Where payment of fees is by instalments, all fees and charges for the year are to be paid in full within that school year. Families who may be experiencing financial difficulties are encouraged to contact the Business Manager in advance of payment dates to negotiate suitable arrangements. Late payments of fees and charges may lead to a debt recovery process being implemented. In addition, a child's enrolment may be terminated if fees and charges are not paid. All costs associated with debt recovery will be added to a family's debt to the College.

## **Notice of Withdrawal of Enrolment**

You are required to provide one full school term's notice in writing prior to the withdrawal of a student from the College. In default of such notice, one term's Tuition Fees will be charged in lieu of notice. This is standard practice in most Independent schools to allow the College to plan employment of staff.

## **Camp and Excursions**

As a condition of enrolment all students are expected to attend class excursions, camps and activities unless exempt due to medical reasons or similar. As attendance is an expectation of enrolment and planning is undertaken based on an expectation of full attendance there is no credit available to families where students do not attend. Should a student not be able to attend a class camp/excursion approval should be sought from the relevant Head of School. As it is expected that students will attend all scheduled camps and excursions, there is no reduction in tuition fees should a student not attend a particular activity.

## **Concession Card Holders**

Families or temporary foster parents holding a valid means-tested concession card are eligible to apply for support for students to attend camps and excursions. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) provides payments for eligible students to attend activities like school camps or trips, swimming and school-organised sport programs, outdoor education programs and excursions and incursions. Eligible parents are required to submit an application form, available from the College in Semester 1 each year. The CSEF provides payments of \$125 per year for eligible primary school students and \$225 per year for eligible secondary school students. Payments are made directly to the school and are linked to the student. The College will then credit any funding received under the CSEF against eligible student's accounts. Families holding a valid means-tested concession card are also eligible for a Kindergarten Fee Subsidy for 4-Year-Old Kinder.
