# STUDENT UNIFORM REGULATIONS

## Introduction

This document outlines the College uniform and presentation standards at King's College. The College uniform helps foster the identity of King's College. It helps establish equality, inclusion and sense of belonging.

Students are required to wear the correct uniform within the College grounds, travelling to and from College and when engaged in College-organised events and activities. On occasions when non-uniform attire is more appropriate, parents and students will be informed beforehand.

## Implementation

The items that constitute the College uniform, for daily wear and for sport and related activities, are outlined in this booklet.

When a student is in school uniform (whether at school or in the community) it is expected that they wear it correctly; it is important, therefore, that:

- all members of our College community accept these guidelines as being a reasonable for an independent Christian school
- all members of our College community are familiar with these guidelines and actively support their outworking; and
- all students understand that it is their responsibility to wear their uniform correctly and support these guidelines

On a day when it is not possible for a student to wear a particular uniform item, a written note from the parent/carer explaining the situation is required.

- In Junior School, students should give uniform notes to their class teacher at the commencement of the school day.
- In Senior School, students should show uniform notes to their Home Group teacher at the commencement of the school day then carry the note in an easily accessible pocket throughout the day.

## Sporting Teams/Excursions

Students who leave the College with a sporting team or on an excursion are representing the College and are expected to be ambassadors of the College. Students not complying with uniform expectations may not be permitted to leave the College with their sporting team or group.

## Uniform Shop

Both the Uniform shop and the Used Uniform shop (convened by the PTFA) are staffed by volunteers. The Uniform shop is located at the rear of the Auditorium and is accessed from the main College car park. Opening times are Monday 3-3:45pm and Friday 8:30-9am. Orders can also be placed online, and queries can be directed to College administration.

## EARLY LEARNING

### 4-YEAR-OLD KINDER GIRLS AND BOYS

<b>Hat</b>	navy; slouch style with College crest
<b>Shoes</b>	covered; appropriate for outside play, thongs or sandals not permitted

### 3-YEAR-OLD KINDER GIRLS AND BOYS

<b>Compulsory Items</b>	
<b>Hat</b>	navy; slouch style with College crest
<b>Shoes</b>	covered; appropriate for outside play, thongs or sandals not permitted

<b>Recommended Items</b>	
<b>Polo Shirt</b>	navy with gold Early Years logo
<b>Play Clothes</b>	appropriate for active outside play

### Backpacks

- The navy College backpack with maroon crest is compulsory for students from Prep to Year 12.
- It is not acceptable to alter the external appearance of backpacks with text, images or additional embellishments.

### Belts

- A black leather College-style belt is to be worn in conjunction with the tailored College shorts and the tailored College trousers worn by boys in Middle and Senior School.
- The following constitutes the regulation College-style belt for King's College:
  - black leather
  - small plain silver buckle
  - no embossing or stamping; the only exception being 'King's College Warrnambool' stamped at the time of manufacturing on the belts available from the Uniform Shop

### Blazers

- The College blazer is a uniform item for Senior School students only.
- It is a compulsory part of both the Summer and Winter uniforms and is to be worn travelling to and from College; this applies equally to bus students as it does to students walking, cycling or being driven to and from College.
- The College blazer is also required to be worn at Assemblies, other formal occasions and when representing the College in uniform.
- When not being worn within the College, blazers should be hung on the coat hooks provided in student lockers.
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### Camps and Study Tours

- Uniform requirements for excursions, camps and study tours will be advised in information pertaining to the event issued to parents at the time.

### Casual Dress Days

- On designated Casual Dress days, students are to be in modest attire with no inappropriate language or imagery present in their chosen outfit.

### Cosmetics

- It is not acceptable for students up to and including Year 9 to wear cosmetics.
- Students in Years 10 to 12 who choose to wear cosmetics are expected to apply them sparingly. This is an expectation within the College grounds, travelling to and from College, when engaged in College-organised events/activities and where in College uniform.
- The following constitutes the only acceptable cosmetics:
  - subtle foundation
  - clear lip gloss
  - clear mascara
  - clear nail polish



## Formal Attire

- There are times during the year when students will be advised they are to dress formally and/or uniformly to suit the occasion rather than the season e.g. for College photographs, for Presentation Evening. Formal uniform is regarded as the Winter Uniform including ties for Senior School boys.

## Hair

- Hair should be well groomed and worn in a suitably tidy style.
- Hair should be of natural shadings with excessive tints to be avoided.
- Whilst students and parents are generally sensible in their judgment, extreme hairstyles are to be avoided and King's College reserves the right to deem a hairstyle as 'extreme and unacceptable.'
- Hair, including fringes, should not obscure the eyes.
- Hair longer than the top of the collar is to be tied back with a regulation hair tie.
- Short hairstyles must be cut no shorter than a number 2 blade.
- Boys must be clean shaven; no beard or stubble permitted.

## Hats

- The College hat is to be worn during the months of September through to April (in accordance with Sun Smart guidelines) when students are outdoors within the College grounds during Recess and Lunch and Physical Education classes, when engaged in College-related outdoor activities in the wider community, or at other times when specifically advised.
- Hats that are torn, frayed, badly faded, marred with graffiti etc. will be required to be repaired or replaced.
- Beanies are not an accepted part of the school uniform

## Jewellery

- The following constitutes the only acceptable jewellery when in College uniform or engaged in College-related activities after hours or within the wider community:
  - one wristwatch of a colour and style consistent with College uniform standards
  - one small plain gold/silver sleeper or stud worn in the lower lobe of each ear or one small plain clear stone stud worn in the lower lobe of each ear (girls only)
  - Visible body piercings (e.g. nose rings, face studs) are not permitted
  - College-presented or College-approved badges worn in the specified positions
  - Medic Alert bracelet/necklace (parents are requested to advise the College in writing)

## Aerosol Products

- Aerosol personal products must not be used by students within the College grounds or when participating in a college-organised activity within the wider community e.g. class excursions, class camps, Compass and Duke of Edinburgh expeditions. Sunscreen, insect repellent, deodorant etc. must be the lotion, roll-on or non-aerosol spray.
- Students in Senior School may bring roll-on or non-aerosol deodorant to school for personal use after physical activities e.g., Physical Education, Sport, Swimming, Musical Production etc.

## Shirts

- The new straight-tail shirt can be worn untucked when not wearing a tie (Term 1 and Term 4). When wearing a tie (Term 2 and Term 3) the shirt must be tucked in. It is accepted that shirts may come untucked during recess and lunchtime depending on the activities being undertaken, however, upon return to class shirts must be tucked in again.

## Shoes

- Black leather lace-up shoes should be noticeably polished and in good condition otherwise suitably repaired or replaced.
- The laces of the black leather shoes should be black and in good repair otherwise replaced.
- Sports shoes are to have non-marking soles and a style commonly accepted as being suitable for sport i.e., a style that provides appropriate support.
- The laces of sports shoes should be in good repair otherwise replaced.

## Shorts and Trousers

- Shorts are Summer uniform items and trousers are a Winter uniform items for boys throughout the College; the exception being that Senior School boys' trousers may be worn all year with the option of shorts in the Summer terms.
- Students in Senior School wear tailored shorts and trousers with belt loops. A black leather College-style belt is to be worn in conjunction with these.

## Socks

- Students are expected to wear the style of socks specified in the Uniform lists.
- Socks are ankle/crew style (anklets are unacceptable).
- In Winter, if girls choose to wear navy knee high socks rather than navy ankle/crew style socks (anklets are unacceptable) or navy opaque tights, it is with the understanding that their skirt is the regulation length (no shorter than mid-calf) and their socks remain pulled up and appear to be tights i.e. no part of the leg below the hem of the skirt is uncovered.

## Scarves and Coats

- **During term 2 and term 3**, the College scarf may be worn travelling to and from school and in the yard at recess and lunchtime. Scarves are not permitted to be worn inside.
- The College coat (navy with College logo) is an outer garment to be worn over the school jumper in Junior School or over the jumper and blazer in Senior School.
- While the coat is a garment for wearing outdoors, **during term 2 and term 3**, students are permitted to wear the coat inside if they are feeling particularly cold. When wearing the coat inside, it must be worn over the jumper in Junior School and over the jumper and blazer in Senior School.

## Sports Uniform

- The sports uniform is worn for Physical Education lessons, on sports days, for off-campus sporting events and for other College-related events and activities as advised e.g., on some field trips, on some excursions, travelling to and from some camps and some study tours
- Students in Junior School wear their sports uniform to College, throughout the day

and home again on the day of their scheduled Physical Education classes.

- Senior School students wear their PE uniform to College on the day of their timetabled **practical** Physical Education classes if that class is scheduled for Period 1 and 2. Students must change back into their school uniform afterwards. Where **practical** Physical Education classes are timetabled in Period 6 and 7, students must change into their Physical education uniform at lunchtime and are permitted to wear the Physical Education uniform home at the end of the school day. For practical Physical Education classes at any other time, students must change into their Physical Education uniform and then change back into their school uniform after the lesson.

### Summer Dresses

- The length of the summer dresses for girls in Junior School must be no shorter than touching the kneecap and no longer than mid-calf.
- The length of the summer skirts for girls in Senior School must be no shorter than touching the knee-cap and no longer than mid-calf.

### Sunglasses

- To assist in the reduction of the amount of UV radiation reaching their eyes, when students are engaged in College-related outdoor activities they are encouraged to wear sunglasses that:
  - meet Australian Standard AS1067
  - are consistent with College uniform standards

### Sun Protection Products

- Students are encouraged to apply a natural-coloured sun protection product (preferably SPF 50+) in the following situations:
  - when outdoors within the College grounds
  - when walking or cycling to and from home and College
  - when engaged in College-related outdoor activities in the wider community

### Ties - Boys

- The College tie is a part of the Senior School uniform for boys **during term 2 and term 3**. It is to be worn within the College and when travelling to and from the College.
- The tie is to be worn correctly: the top button of the shirt is to be fastened and covered by the tie; the knot should be firm; and the tip of the tie should sit just above the belt.
- The tie is available in several lengths to allow students to wear it correctly regardless of height.

### Undergarments

- It is not acceptable for students to wear:
  - coloured undergarments that are clearly visible through the fabric of outer garments
  - long-sleeved tops that extend beyond the sleeves of the school shirt, dress or blouse.
  - t-shirts etc. with a motif underneath school shirts or blouses

### **Winter Skirts/Pinafores**

- The regulation length of pinafores for girls in Junior School is no shorter than just below the knee.
- The regulation length of winter skirts for girls in Senior School is no shorter than mid-calf.

### **Uniform Non-Compliance**

Students who do not follow or abide by the College Uniform Regulations, will be managed as outlined in the College Student Management Framework.
